






Mission and Resources

The Pennsylvania Military Museum preserves and honors Pennsylvania's military history from 1747 to the present, interpreting for citizens and visitors the story of the Commonwealth's "Citizen Soldiers", civilian activities on the home front, and the contributions of Pennsylvania industry to military technology.

Goals include promoting interest in the military museum, assisting with projects in the museum and on the grounds, providing and facilitating educational programming, and establishing fundraising activities in order to accomplish the above-stated and related purposes

The Museum, currently

- Officially opened, Sunday, May 25, 1969
- Currently five PHMC staff members
- Four buildings
- Approx. 70 acres
- 31 Memorials and Monuments
- 276 years of history in our mission
- Approximately 13,000 items in the collection

- Volunteer Hours: over 6,000






Goals/Initiatives

- Increase direct caregiver awareness on veteran exploitation through training offered to PA professionals
- Increase annual distribution of pension poaching toolkit via listserv
- Continue connections with community and state agencies via education, data share, and quarterly guest speakers
- Re-establish Arts in Residency program offered through PA Council on the Arts in all six veteran long-term care homes





Updates

- 63 partners received Pension Poaching toolkit (compared to 36 last year)
- 3 collaborative efforts; 1 guest speaker
- 3 of 6 Veterans Homes reinstating the Arts in Residency Program; 4th home in progress
- Pennsylvania's Master Plan for Older Adults

- Social media post in June

Goals of PA Apprenticeship and Training Office (ATO)

- <u>Increase</u> the number of Registered Apprenticeship (RA) opportunities in PA
- <u>Expand</u> into non-traditional occupations, serving traditionally underrepresented populations
- <u>Raise Awareness</u> about the benefits of RAs and how to access them
- <u>Advocate</u> for RAs as a premier solution to meet workforce needs
- <u>Provide programs to support and resources needed</u> to align with PA standards and practices.

Updates

- Expansion of Pre-Apprenticeship Division
- 2022-23: first graduating class able to complete a pre-apprenticeship program as a HS graduation option by Act 158: Alternative Pathways to Graduation legislation
- Three funding opportunities in March/April: -<u>DEI</u>, -<u>Nursing</u>, -<u>Broadband</u>
- Awarded \$3.9 million Apprenticeship Building America (ABA) grant through the USDOL
- Building and Supporting a Certified Teacher RA Program in Pennsylvania: NGA seeking proposals for apprenticeship framework creating pathways for certified educators.
- 1,378 active apprentices are identified veterans, out of the 16,702 total.

Challenges/Barriers

• Combating misconceptions/miseducation on Registered Apprenticeships, and reaching audiences

Goals of the Troops to Teachers (TTT) Program

- <u>Assist</u> transitioning service members with meeting necessary requirements for teaching certification
- <u>Provide</u> individualized counseling to select the best pathway based on unique needs, goals, & skills
- Address teacher shortage in K-12 schools that serve low-income families in critical areas

Updates

- TTT is being transferred to the Military-Civilian Transition Office as of October 1, 2023
- Over 10,000 veterans received TTT information, and 45 obtained teaching certification
- Approximately 30 veterans in the enrollment process for certification programs
- Over 350 veterans have expressed interest in PA teaching certifications since September 2022
- Currently working with Mercyhurst University (MU) to reach 9,500 veterans <u>across the country</u> to provide information on PA teaching opportunities, to attract veterans to PA:
 - 50% tuition discount through MU
 - One-year online program
 - Flexible student teaching placement

Challenges/Barriers

• Tuition funding for the TTT participants





Goals of PA Office of Vocational Rehabilitation (OVR)

- <u>Assist</u> eligible, disabled veterans to prepare for, enter into, and retain completive integrated employment in a career of choice suited to their interests, strengths, and overall abilities
- <u>Increase</u> referral timeliness from initial contact to receiving services and successful outcomes

Challenges/Barriers

- Awareness of OVR and how to apply via CWDS or calling a local OVR office
- Ability to advocate for needs and request reasonable accommodations to be successful
- Rural transportation resources
- Needing skill and credential attainment to unlock middle income career opportunities
- Understanding how OVR, WF programs & USDVA can collaborate and braid funding

Goals/Initiatives

- PA Women Veterans Publication Compilation and Release
- SCI Muncy Women Veterans VSU & American Legion VSO Collaboration
- Working to nominate women veterans for the 2024 Women's History Month celebration, hosted by the Governor's Advisory Commission on Women.





Updates

- Date is set to release the Women Veterans Publication for PA in June 2024 for Women Veterans Day.
- Collaborations with Ally Murr (American Legion VSO) & Celeste Bruchlacker (SCI Muncy VSU Unit Manager).





Challenges/Barriers

- Obtaining email addresses for older women veterans.
- VFW and American Legion relationships to come together as a whole and involve one another in events.

Goals/Initiatives

- Improve outreach efforts to veteran staff within the Department of Corrections (DOC) through collaboration with external agencies
- Expand/enhance programming, workshops, and educational/employment opportunities within the veteran service units (VSUs)
- Increase the amount/availability of veteran-specific trainings and/or educational opportunities for employees/spouses/dependents
- Advocate for the creation/enhancement of veteran treatment courts/tracks
- Educate those that represent veterans in the criminal justice system





Updates

- Veteran services presentation for PA Parole Board and regional hearing examiners.
- SCI Dallas held the DOC's second veteran employee symposium.
- SCI Mercer American Legion Post #110 commencement ceremony.
- Memorial Day ceremonies at SCI facilities.
- Promotion of VSU placement by DMVA and DOC personnel at SCI Smithfield and Huntingdon.
- "Shark Tank" event at SCI Houtzdale.
- DOC leadership met with DS Cook from the Dept. of Agriculture to advance the pending greenhouse MOU.
- The DOC has hired 118 veterans this year, as of 7/15.





Challenges/Barriers

- Early identification for criminal-justice involved veterans: Possibility of identifying them in the criminal complaint
- Nursing home care for hard-to-place (HTP) veterans paroled or approaching their maximum date of sentence
- Training first responders dealing with veterans in crisis
- Sufficient specialized programming and professionals to assist those incarcerated with PTSD and/or TBI
- Technological barriers for utilizing PA VETConnect
- Effective networking between the VSUs
