



Update for Veterans' Homes

PSSH

- To begin renovation project in skilled nursing areas on October 1, 2017.
- Will displace 14 residents during this project 8 to SWVC, 1 to home, 1 to VA, and 4 other nursing facilities in Erie.

GMVC

 Renovation project to the resident living areas to be completed December 1, 2017.

DVVH

- To begin renovation project in Personal Care Unit (PCU) on August 8, 2018.
- This project will displace/transfer 41 residents from the PCU.
- Residents will be offered SEVC/HVH/PSSH for transfer.
- Upon completion PCU beds will be converted to skilled nursing







AMPUTEE & PARALYZED VETERANS PENSION




Amputee & Paralyzed Veterans Pension \$3,714,000




DISABLED VETERANS TAX EXEMPTION PROGRAM


