Gold Star Spouses Day

Gold Star Spouses Day - April 5th

Gold Star Spouses Day on April 5th honors the surviving loved ones of military service members who died while serving their country. The day offers remembrance for the spouses and their families and a time of recognition of their sacrifices. Many communities and organizations hold events showing support for Gold Star families on this day. Through ceremonies, teas, memorial races, and luncheons, they honor and remember fallen warriors.

National Submarine Day - April 11th

National Submarine Day, on April 11th, honors the day the United States Navy acquired its first modern commissioned submarine. On April 11, 1900, the Holland VI became the Navy's first modern submarine.

Submarine history runs deep in the United States. During the Revolutionary War era, David Bushnell built America's first submarine, the *Turtle*. The submersible made several attempts to sink British ships but never succeeded. At the time, the U.S. Navy did not exist, so the *Turtle* was not the Navy's first submarine. The first known U.S. Navy submarine was the USS *Alligator*. It's also the fourth United States Navy ship of that name. The *Alligator* was active during the American Civil War.





Air Force Reserve Birthday - April 14th

The United States Air Force Reserve celebrates its birthday every year on April 14, but according to the Air Force official site, Air Force Reservists can trace their heritage all the way back to the National Defense Act of 1916.

The Air Force Reserve was created on April 14, 1948 soon after the establishment of the Air Force as a separate branch of service. But this history would be incomplete without recognition of events just prior to and the establishment of the National Defense Act of 1916 which authorized the creation of reserve forces as an ongoing part of American military organization.

National Earth Day - April 22nd

Earth Day is an annual event on April 22 to demonstrate support for environmental protection. First held on April 22, 1970, it now includes a wide range of events coordinated globally by Earthday.org (formerly Earth Day Network) including 1 billion people in more than 193 countries. 




INVENTORY ITEMS...

MEMO INFROMATION: SOLAR ECLIPSE on 04/08/2024

The City of Pittsburgh / SWVC is in the 80% viewing location or pathway for the solar eclipse on Monday, April 8. Staff / Residents / Family are encouraged to review these frequently asked questions (FAQs) to ensure they're prepared and where traffic delays are expected incase trying to travel to SWVC.

When will the eclipse happen? This rare event will be Monday, April 8. The partial phase will start at approximately 2:02 p.m. "Totality" will begin at approximately 3:16 p.m. and last until 3:20 p.m. The partial phase will end at 4:30 p.m.

What can I expect? During the three minutes and 41 seconds of totality, from 3:16 to 3:20 p.m., the afternoon sky will become dark as the moon passes between the sun and the Earth. Changes in temperature and weather are possible.

How will SWVC be impacted? On April 8th Southwestern Veterans Center will be in the 80% path of the eclipse.

What can I expect on April 8? Traffic delays and congestion in our area will happen. Weather maybe affected as well in our area so please plan accordingly for this.


What should I do if I plan to visit SWVC? Visitation is always welcomed, but it is recommended to be at the facility prior to the beginning of the eclipse phase at approximately 2:02 p.m. or after the eclipse phase at approximately 4:30 p.m.

What parts of the SWVC will be closed on April 8? Southwestern Veterans Center will be open except its outside patios that will be closed only during the phase of the eclipse at approximately 2:02 p.m. until the complete of the eclipse phase at approximately 4:30 p.m. Normal outside patio operations will go back in place after the eclipse phase.

Also, be aware that:

- Some operations will be slightly changed during the phase of the eclipse at approximately 2:02 p.m. until the complete of the eclipse phase at approximately 4:30 p.m.
- Security will be on hand to assist with all accommodations.
- Security will be providing extra safety and security coverage during the eclipse phase to make sure our Residents / Staff / Families are not in any form of danger during this time.
- Their will be no resident transportation in the afternoon during the during the phase of the eclipse at approximately 2:02 p.m. until the complete of the eclipse phase at approximately 4:30 p.m.
- All Residents / Staff / Family are encouraged to stay away from all windows during the phase of the eclipse at approximately 2:02 p.m. until the complete of the eclipse phase at approximately 4:30 p.m.
- ➤ If something doesn't look right or if you see any suspicious activity, contact SWVC Security at X0 or at 412-665-6706 if that line is busy then dial X6742 or at 412-665-6742.
- Please refer to PennDOT's website or local news for alerts and route information for our area.





Viewing The Solar Eclipse

- Eclipse viewing is a safe and enjoyable experience if you take the necessary measures to protect yourself with some basic information and take simple precautions.
- Do not look directly at the sun. Certified eclipse glasses must be worn to protect your eyes from the harmful rays of the sun. Regular sunglasses will not protect your eyes during a total solar eclipse.
- Do not take photographs of the eclipse or use binoculars or telescopes without proper equipment and filters.
- Keep children under close supervision during the eclipse to ensure they do not remove their eclipse glasses or look directly at the sun.
- Be aware of your surroundings, as the sudden darkness during a total solar eclipse can cause disorientation and confusion.
- > Be prepared for changes in temperature and weather during the eclipse.
- > Follow any safety instructions or guidelines provided by our Security Department.
