D-Day, June 6, 1944 has come to be known as a day of something momentous. The D in D-Day stands for Day. It is a code for the day of any important invasion or military operation. It is shorthand used in place of an actual date. It can be used to signify an occasion of great importance in one's life such as marriage. In the history of the United States it was a day that was the beginning of the end of the war against Hitler with the largest amphibious invasion in history. On that day 160,000 Allied troops of the Us, Uk, and Canada stormed the beaches of Normandy. Utah, Omaha, Gold, Juno, and Sword in France. This invasion was the turning point of WWWII.

The war on the beaches lasted until August 30, 1944 and ended with the liberation of France. On D-Day at least 4,000 Allied forces gave their lives to defeat an evil force in the world. When we say D Day, we are recalling a day of great importance.

Called Old Glory or The Stars and Stripes it is the symbol of our patriotism and pride in our country. Flags can be seen flying over government buildings and private homes during the year. Flags are flown half mast to signify the loss of a significant person in our country. Flags are folded into the familiar triangle at the funeral of a deceased veteran and given to the family in honor of his or her service. It is an important symbol of the United States, so important that there there is a protocol when displaying or discarding a flag. Flag day on June 14 is not a national holiday but it is a day of importance. What began as thirteen stripes and thirteen stars for thirteen colonies has grown to be thirteen stripes and 50 stars, one for each of the 50 states. It is said that Betsy Ross made the first flag. The design was approved by the Continental Congress on June 14, 1777. Pennsylvania was the first state to celebrate Flag Day as a state holiday. States have been added once the state citizens made the decision to become a state. The last state to do so was Hawaii in 1959. We have four major territories who may in the future be candidates to become states and join the union as full participants in our democracy.
