 - Cross train on what is offered, basic eligibility, how to refer to seek enrollment
 - Aging Waiver; Community Health Choices coming; OPTIONS through PDA
- Cross trainings
 - Veterans system supports and programs \leftarrow \rightarrow traditional aging network
- Person Centered Counseling
 - Info from VSOs quick reference sheet on what VSO can do to help → PCC staff
 - Look at areas of need outside veterans-system resources
- Many PA Link partners that provide in home care
 - MA, PP, Insurance, long term 'contract' vs short term



How to address these issues:

- Cross-system collaboration and education develop plans to address the following

 - VSOs could speak at local PA Link partner meetings/other collaboratives
 - Market VSO info and how they can help (e.g. Aid and Attendance)
 - Invite aging providers to speak at Veterans meetings, posts, etc.
 - Put info about non-traditional supports that could benefit Aging Veterans in the DMVA Digest or send out to VSOs electronically
 - Refer aging Veterans who need more to PCC or aging network provider

 - to children of honorably discharged Veterans who have service-connected disabilities.

FDUCATIONAL GRATUITY PROGRAM

Educational Gratuity program provides financial assistance to children of honorably discharged veterans who have service-connected disabilities and served during a <u>period of war</u> (PDF) or armed conflict or children of veterans who die or died in service during a period of war or armed conflict.

Veteran's eligibility criteria:

- · Died in service during a period of war or armed conflict or,
- · A veteran who has:
 - An honorable discharge from the U.S. military
 - Served during established war service dates as determined by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs. **The following decorations can also be used to establish wartime service: Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal or Navy Expeditionary Medal
- Veteran must have a 100% permanent and total service-connected disability rating by the U.S.
 Department of Veterans Affairs.


Child's eligibility criteria:

- Must be between the ages of 16 and 23, living within the Commonwealth five years prior to application and must attend a school within the Commonwealth.
- Applicant must have a financial need.

Payments: Payment will not exceed \$500 00 ner term or semester ner qualified child to each annroyed



We have done an excellent job of sharing information on these courses and our classes have been filled to Capacity. We will continue to advocate for funding consideration to support additional classes during the remainder of the year.

Judiciary Committee

- During our April 5th meeting, we had the pleasure to include special guests, Maj. Gen (R) Weller as well as Secretary John Wetzel (DOC) to our discussion panel, and their input and support was very much appreciated.
- Previously, I had mentioned that all incoming inmate veterans via the DOC receive an "Inmate Veteran Information Packet." I
 have copies of the packet to share with the committee for your review.
- Update: The Western Region now has a new Veteran Services Unit, which is located at SCI- Mercer. I have had the pleasure to be part of this project from the beginning, and I am very excited and optimistic about the future of veteran services within this region and facility.
- On April 10th, Secretary Wetzel aired an episode of "Bustin Walls" which is a podcast via the DOC. During the episode, I was interviewed and asked about my background as well as Veteran Services initiatives and Veterans Service Units within the DOC. The episode was shared with Criminal Justice professionals throughout the state and country. This was a great opportunity to share information about veteran services and promote similar initiatives among our peers. - We discussed the importance of continued veteran outreach within our prisons, in order to better prepare our fellow veterans for a successful reentry back into society. It is imperative for all of us to continue with our joint efforts and support.
- PBPP can also play an important role in successful reentry by assisting incarcerated veterans via the Veterans Service Unit's.

 DOC policy indicates that each VSU should provide a RPA (Reentry Parole Agent) to assist the inmates with parole preparation as well as home/employment plans and Community Corrections Center placement. Currently, the DOC has agreements with (3) CCC's to house and assist veterans with their transition. These centers include Tomorrow's Hope, ADAPPT, and Coleman Hall.
- Veteran identification and services within the PA Courts was discussed to include details from House Bill 887, which promotes statewide counties to set up Veteran Courts. Currently, many veterans are going through the court system without being properly identified and/or treated for their PTSD and related conditions.
- Committee member, Terry Stokes will address the Council on House Bill 887 and Veteran Courts. He is a Veterans Court Advocate for the PA VFW.



Introduction

Who are we? Pennsylvania Assistive Technology Foundation (PATF) is a statewide, non-profit organization that provides education and financing for people with disabilities and older Pennsylvanians for the purchase of assistive technology (AT) devices and services.

Pennsylvania Assistive Technology Foundation (PATF)

PATF offers two cash loan programs:

- ✓ Mini-Loan Program
- √ Low-Interest Loan Program

Who is eligible to apply?

Pennsylvanians of all ages, income levels, and disabilities or health conditions. *Must be willing and able to repay a loan*.



Mini-Loan Program

Mini-Loan Program: \$100 to \$1,500 at 0% interest. \$20/month minimum payment.





Low-Interest Loan Program

Low-Interest Loan Program (\$1,500 and above)

Non-Guaranteed (up to \$60,000 at 3.75%)

Guaranteed (up to \$25,000 at 3.75%)





Why Choose PATF Over a Traditional Lender?

- PATF provides low interest loans and extended repayment terms, therefore the payments are more affordable.
- PATF has more flexible eligibility requirements.
- PATF offers information about possible funding resources, provides financial education, reports repayments (helps build credit!), and can provide a rescue payment if an emergency happens.



Other Resources and Funding for AT

Home and Community-Based Waivers

Waiver services make it possible for people with disabilities to live (with supports) in the community (and not a nursing home or other institution).

There are both functional and financial requirements that must be met for each waiver.

Office of Vocational Rehabilitation (OVR)

 provides vocational rehabilitation services to help persons with disabilities prepare for, obtain, or maintain employment. Contact 800-442-6351.
